SHOW RULES FOR EXHIBITORS

PLEASE READ THESE RULES CAREFULLY

The Alderley Edge Allotment and Gardens Society Committee would like to thank all the sponsors who have donated raffle prizes.

1. The object of the Annual Show is to promote, foster and encourage interest in horticulture and crafts for all ages.
2. Entries in the Flower, Fruit and Vegetable Classes must be grown by the exhibitor in their own garden or allotment.
3. In any of the Domestic Crafts Classes the exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor.
4. Any exhibitor may stage any number of entries in any class. No one exhibit may be entered into more than one class.
5. The entry fee for each proposed exhibit, together with the completed ENTRY FORM, must be delivered to: 19 Windermere Drive, Alderley Edge SK9 7UP, no later than 8pm Wednesday 28th August. Only the Show Committee may authorize the receiving of a late entry under special circumstances.
6. Vases must be provided by exhibitors for their entries in the flower classes.
7. Staging of exhibits must be done between 4pm – 8pm. on Friday 30th August or from 8am – 8.30am on Saturday 31st August. No exhibit, however, will be allowed into the Show after 8.30am when the doors will be finally closed. Exhibitor's tickets must be obtained from the Show Secretary prior to staging in the Hall.
8. No exhibitor may be allowed to remain in the venue whilst judging is taking place.
9. If no exhibit in a given class is deemed worthy of a first or any other prize the judges will say so.
10. The Show will open to exhibitors and visitors at 12 noon with awards and trophies presented from 3pm.
11. No exhibits may be removed from the Show until after the Raffle Draw.
12. While all reasonable care will be taken, the Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage to any exhibit or personal property of an exhibitor.
13. Any unforeseen incident arising will be dealt with by a Show Secretary assisted by any two members of the Show Committee.
14. Any reasonable objection must be lodged with a Show Secretary no later than 1.30pm on Show Day. The Show Manager and any two members of the Show Committee will decide the outcome.
15. All exhibits in the Flower, Fruit and Vegetable classes will be judged in accordance with the suggestions contained in the current Royal Horticultural Society Handbook.
16. The Show Committee reserve the right to inspect the Garden or Allotment of any intending exhibitor at any time prior to the Show.
17. Prize Money is for children and will be available for collection from the Prize Money Desk on the afternoon of the Show from 2.30 – 3.00pm. 1st prize £1, 2nd prize 50p, 3rd prize 30p.
18. Any prize money not claimed in person or in writing, within a week of the Show, will eventually be deemed to be a donation to the Society and be recorded as such.

7. 3 Dahlias of any kind
8. 3 Chrysanthemums of a kind
9. Display of Chrysanthemums, own foliage
10. Single stem Roses

20. A miniature Garden display, maximum size 22x36cm.

FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

21. 5 different kinds of Vegetables/fruit, displayed not exceeding 75 x 60 cms
22. 3 different kinds of Vegetables/fruit (potatoes excluded) displayed in a space not exceeding 50 x 35 cms
23. 6 Onions Dressed – grown from seed displayed in area 50 x 35 cms
24. 1 Onion Heaviest Dressed max stem 3 inches (7.5 cms)
25. 4 Onions Dressed – each not exceeding 12 oz in weight grown from sets
26. 4 Onions Dressed – each not exceeding 8 oz in weight grown from sets
27. 5 ordinary Tomatoes with stalks
28. 6 small Fruited or Cherry tomatoes
29. 3 Beef Steak tomatoes
30. 1 truss of Tomatoes
31. 5 Apples
32. A plate of one type of stone fruit (15 max) – not exceeding 23 cms in diameter
33. A plate of soft fruit (15 max) – not exceeding 23 cms in diameter
34. Pair of Marrows (not courgettes) not exceeding 30 cms in length

35. 1 Marrow (heaviest) named variety from seed packet

37. 3 Courgettes between 10 and 15 cms long,with flower (the flower should not take up more than 15cm)

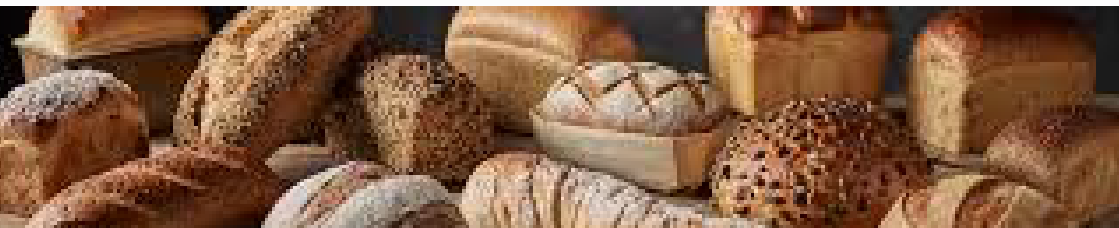

SHOW GUIDE FOR FRUIT AND VEGETABLE CLASSES

Condition - Fresh and tender and blemish free

Uniformity - Don't automatically pick the biggest!

Entries should be well matched for size and shape

Staging - Clean, not scrubbed, attractive presentation

Labelling - Variety named, where possible, placed with your entry card

Heaviest/Longest – It is all about the weight/size and nothing else!

Check that your entry matches the description for the Class in the Schedule –
and read the Rules of the Show carefully.
